We will use the Development Matters and Early Learning Goal objectives for Expressive Arts and Design, Literacy and Communication and Language to support children. Other areas such as physical development and mathematical awareness will also be supported. We aim to ensure that every child has access to creative and rich experiences that will then continue throughout their journey at Amberley.
